8. Frankfurt Parliament (May)

- freely elected parliament - 1st one!
- proclaimed government system  
to balance out the monarchy
- establishment of basic rights
- failed to create a constitution  
 governs the government

## 9. Erfurt Union (1849)

- begins his rise to power (1862)





Arms Race: why don't they just stop?

- German Fleet Acts
- GB feels threatened, turns toward one time rivals
- 1902, Entente cordiale (GB/FR)
- 1907, Anglo-Russian (GB/RUS)

- Pan-Slav



"All" = this goes w/ the idea of nationalism

- Ferdinand  $\rightarrow$  annex <sup>Austria/Hungary</sup> Bosnia

- 1908 Crisis

- July 1908, Young Turks in Constantinople

- Serbia threatens to come to aid of Bosnia, Germany invade you if you interfere in annexation

- Austria/Hungary annexes anyway

- 1912-13 Wars

- Ottoman Empire trying to hang on

1<sup>st</sup> war - Lasted from October  $\rightarrow$  December

- Started ARMISTICE

2<sup>nd</sup> war -

- Young Turks rise up again

- January  $\rightarrow$  May

- Ends Ottoman hold on anything in Europe

- "The Spark" - Assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand

- Heir to the Austrian/Hungarian thrown, they don't like his wife

- Travelling to Sarajevo to smooth things out between him and Bosnia.

- It's also his anniversary //

- Serbian, Slavic (Pan-Slavism)

6/28/1914 - assassinated by members  
of the Black Hand

- Shoots Ferdinand
- Gavrillo tries to shoot himself, doesn't work, tries cyanide, doesn't work; arrested

- Germany plans to invade France through ~~over~~ Belgium and Holland
- Belgrade is bombed
- Schlieffen Plan → schlieffen ~~plan~~  
is not in power by the time they use it (von Moltke)  
Was not implemented how it was original intended
- Sent troops East, met resistance in Belgium

### Mobilization

- 7/31 → Russia begins full mobilization  
→ French leaders demand France mobilizes  
→ German command panics  
8/1 → Germany declares war

[Treaty of London (1939)]

- between GB, Aus, Fra, Prussia, Russia, and Belgium

- True real reason for danger → honor.
- Everyone blames someone else

The alliance system was a mess

- ↳ Some had expired, new alliances
- ↳ If you keep the alliances a secret it's not a true deterrent for conflict

## The Great War

- Wars before this time, "romanticized"
- Wars before you left as a honor, came back with adventure stories, come home a hero
- This war... Changes the "romanticism" why?

### • WWI → Total War

Total war: when a country puts all of its resources towards supporting a war effort

- Draft / Conscription
- women working in factories
- Gov't control of economics


### • Shift in technology

- "Rode in on horses, rode out on planes"
- Planes, machine guns, trench warfare
- 1st industrial and scientific war
- Many of the technology had been used before, but now they have matured and they are used all at once
- Chemical warfare to ~~support~~ <sup>combat</sup> trench warfare
- putting together all of our scientific knowledge in order to kill more efficiently - new concept.

## Trench warfare

Description:- large underground bunkers  
 - progressively more improved trenches w/ interconnecting trenches

### Technology:



Germans → dug deep trenches  
 British → shallow

## Machine Gun

Description: 400-800 rounds per min  
 Use: Anti-personnel (against people)  
 Impact: most influential weapon of this war b/c of the effectiveness

Frontline: mounted to airplanes and armored vehicles

## Artillery

Description: large caliber weapon capable of direct(gun) or indirect fire

Impact: "soften up" target, enhance long range attacks (60 miles!!)

## Grenades

Description: small, explosive device thrown or projected to cause burst and shrapnel damage

## Aircraft

Description: 100 mph — Super fast for the time  
constructed of canvas stretched over a wooden frame

Impact:

- Anti-aircraft weapon development
- Aircraft for weapon, not just intelligence
- Air support for troops

## Submarines

Description: underwater vessel, disrupt trade; civilian life

Impact: creation of weapons to fight.

## Convoy System

Description: sailing in zig-zag pattern to avoid U-boats (submarines)

- The Race to the Sea
  1. The Western Front
    - main theatre of the war
    - line from Switzerland to North Sea
    - T-BOIL shape in 1914 when fighting started from attempted attack
    - stalemate? Dig further north.  
still @ stalemate? Dig further north.
- Other odd technologies
  - gas masks
  - periscope guns
- Mustard Gas
  - Harsh → boils, blisters, and other disfigurement
  - Connection?? "monstrous vermin"

1/31/17 - Germany declares unrestricted submarine war on ships

2/19/17 - "Zimmerman Note"  
telegram to Mexico from Germany, trying to strike a deal w/ Mexico and Japan

- If you join us in battle against USA, we will give you back what they have taken from you (territories)
- More propaganda recruiting Americans to sign-up "We Should Go To War!!"

3/20/17 - Russia leaves WWI because of the revolution

- Germany focus on the western front (British/French)
- British/French ask USA to come fight the war

USA had been investing money and other resources

If it looks like they are losing then they should send traps to help them win i.e. protect their investment

4/6/17 - USA enters the war

- 4 million troops
- "The world must be safe for democracy" fight for the rights of small nations
- Balkans

## Problems for Germany in WWI


- war longer than expected
- political issues: - taking power from Kaiser
- social / economic: British Blockade of Northern German ports. Inflation
- USA entering the war at the end
  - ↳ technology, man power
  - ↳ attacks depleted German reserves
- Five emperors of 1918

- official end of war document
- why Versailles? French wanted symbolism (this is where Germany was created to begin with after the Franco-Prussian war)

- 1919 Zapata, assassinated
- Alvaro Obregon
  - 1920, president

- Treaty of Brest-Litovsk (Big one!)

Background The Germans wanted Russians out of the war so they could focus on the Western Front

- Lenin was trying to overthrow the Russian government

- 12/1917 - Bolsheviks agree to cease fire
- 3/1918 - Agree to peace treaty
  - "Gave up millions of square miles of land to Germany (Ukraine)

Way Back machine

- Crimean War. In the end Russia says Sure Germany, you can have it.

- Access to sea, land, Ukraine

Kulaks

~~★~~ - Farmers who grow wheat (Bread!!)  
But! Germans lost WWI, so it was never implemented. (no peace, no land switch)

- Civil War Breaks Out - (Russia)

Bolsheviks

- Red Army
- Supported by Germany (I wonder how the people of Germany felt supporting another country while their own country was in peril...?)
- But why? Why are they supporting?

VS.

White Russians

- Landlords / Land owners
- Supported by winners of WWI

- Foreign Intervention
  - Promoted sense of nationalism
  - Propaganda
- Lenin refuses to pay the debt

### Russian Civil War (1918 - 1922)

Economic Issues

- Industrial prod. declines 80%
- Even before WWI

Political Issues

- Farming  $\frac{1}{3}$  the level
- Bolsheviks committed, guerrilla warfare
- White army, supported by foreign investment

Result

White army loses, Bolsheviks in power.  
Lenin in power.

### The New Economic Plan (NEP)

Context

- Western nations do not like communism, disagree = refuse to trade
- Isolation Soviet Union
- Difficult to switch to the New System
- Attempt to improve the economy through a free market system (mixing Capitalism; Socialism together)
  - ↳ works well to begin with
  - ↳ Lenin dies from a stroke (1924)
  - ↳ power vacuum!! Trotsky vs. Stalin

- Intellectual leader of the Red Army
- world revolution doctrine
- opposed NEP
- Idealist (theory)

- "Socialism in one country"

- Supported the NEP

## Japan Becomes an Imperial Power

- Japan was feudal
- 1853 - Matthew Perry forces open trade
- 1868 - Traditional Government falls apart
  - Meiji Era Begins
  - Leaders go to study from western world
  - Industrialism / Modernize

## New Constitution is formed

- Took ideas from the Prussian Constitution
- Meiji Constitution
  - Emperor at the top
  - Military answers to emperor

## Hirohito Become Emperor (Showa)

- Appoints Tojo as Prime Minister

## Itohiki Tojo

- Imperialized
  - ↳ invade Korea, Northern China, Manchuria (Kill & take land)
- Believed in Racial Superiority of the Japanese People, especially the Chinese
- Ultra-nationalistic
- (1933) - Ultimately in charge
  - Supporter of Nazi Germany
  - Want an ally against Russia
  - Leader during WWII
- 1948 - Eventually executed for war crimes

## Post WWII Japan

- Growing population, economic depression
- Exclusion Acts (No Chinese Allowed)
- Looking for markets to sell goods
- Pan-Asianism (Asia is one)

## Military and Political Ideologies

- Invasion is necessary
- "Korea is the dagger into the heart of Japan"
  - To protect Japan, control Korea
  - To protect Korea, control Manchuria
  - To protect Manchuria, control China
- If they resist - fire them!

## \* Connection to Fascism

↳ Remember the 14 Points so you can apply it to other leaders to analyze if they are a fascist leader

## Agression in Asia

- 1931 - Japan invades Manchuria
  - Japan leaves League of Nations
  - Japan has control of major cities
  - Rape of Nanking
    - ↳ Japanese did not think the Manchurians were the same level of human as Japanese
    - ↳ Targeted women (Rape, Abuse)
    - ↳ 6-8 weeks, 300,000 killed

## Armenian Genocide

- 1st genocide of the 20<sup>th</sup> century
- Ottoman Empire 1915 - 1923
- More than 1.5 million Armenians killed
  - 2 million lived in O.E. @ the time

[3/4 killed]

### seeds of Genocide

- D.F. was in decline
- 50,000 Muslim refugees
- Armenians often subjected to massacres, abuse
- 2nd class citizens

### Preparations for Genocide

- Special groups of Turks and Kurds (released prisoners - created to carry out the massacre)
- Many Armenians drafted
- Spread of rumors of Armenians betraying Turkey (infidels)
- Community leaders arrested
  - 4/24/1915, put to death
    - ↳ creates less organization
    - ↳ Chaos
  - ↳ controlling govt can choose leaders
- Committee of Union and Progress (Young Turks)
- 4/24/1915
  - Intellectuals killed
  - Armenian population defenseless
- Technology
  - women, children, elderly put on trains to "relocate" them (brought to killing grounds)
  - Refugees flee into the caves (die from asphyxiation (fire in caves, no oxygen))

- Government sanctions killing of Armenians (you are against the gov't if you support the Armenians at all — no orphanages).
- Hitler uses this genocide as a blueprint for the Holocaust
  - attack leaders
  - trains
  - Gov't directives
  - NO one stopped it.
- Many foreign reports — no action.
- Near East Relief
  - 1st US international Red Cross Relief  
(See slide for more info)
- Perpetrators Prosecuted / Executed
- 1st time we are using the term "genocide"

### London Economic Conference

**Goal:** organize a coordinated attack in the global depression

- Essential to revive world trade
- Roos event withdraw from conference
  - ↳ caused the conference to collapse
- Emphasized isolationism and American "protectionism"

### Munich Conference (1938)

**Goal:** To establish last territorial claim by Hitler

- appeasement (Hitler) Claim what?!  
Didn't see coming
- ★ Hitler ends of ignoring agreement

### Molotov-Ribbentrop Treaty (1939)

**Goal:** Form alliance to avoid aggression

- Alliance between USSR & Germany
- Defined Secret Protocols: spheres of influence
- Agreed to take over Poland

★ later violated by Hitler. (I sense a theme here...)

1939 - 1942 :- Axis powers dominate Europe, N. Africa, & Asia

- Germany used blitzkrieg tactics, very successful
- Germany; Italian armies dominate N. Africa threatened Suez canal & oil fields in the Middle East

## Havana Conference (1940)

Goal: To uphold the Monroe doctrine in the face of global aggression

Monroe =  
5th US  
President

- warns European nations that US would not tolerate colonization or puppet monarchy.



↳ Figurehead installed by a power to provide the appearance of local authority - existing power maintains control.

## Churchill; FDR meet (8/1941)

Goal: common governing principles

1. territorial gains
  2. territorial adjustment benefit the country's people
  3. Self-determination
  4. trade barriers lowered
  5. Global economic cooperation ; advancement of Social Welfare
  6. Freedom from want; fear
  7. Freedom from war
  8. Disarmament of aggressor nations
- Establish "post-war world"
  - System of general security
  - FDR hoped ↑ in popularity of war (it did not..)

## Casablanca (1943)

Goal:

## Eairo (1943) - US, Britain, China

Goal: Determine post war settlement of Asia.

- Restore land to China from Japan
- Secure Korea
- Return Taiwan; Manchuria

## Tehran (1943)

**Goal**: Soviet committing to help in the war after Germany was defeated

"Wearers of war"

different areas of the war where the action was happening  
Pacific, Asian, N. Africa, European  
(to name a few)

## 5/18/17 Bretton Woods Economic (1944)

**Goal**: Stabilize economy and monetary funds

- International monetary fund
- Fix exchange rate
- Bank reconstruction; development

## Yalta (1945)

**Goal**: Plan for Europe after the war

- Send troops to help US in Japan
- Allow self-determination in Nazi occupied territories
- How to occupy Germany
- Soviet compensation

Accomplished

- Stability, Division of Germany, Persecution of criminals



Truman Doctrine 3/1947

- containing communism
  - Civil war in Greece; Turkey  
Over water rights
  - US will give aid as long as  
you stay "free" (not communist)

## The Marshall Plan (1948)

- European Recovery Program
    - US provide aid to all European nations that need it
  - This plan is against hunger, desperation, homelessness in order to avoid terrible leaders from rising (basic needs met = drastic change not needed)

## The Berlin Blockade ; Airlift 1948

- combine zones (allied zone).
  - leads to the division of east: west  
(West Berlin, East Berlin)

NSC 68 : 1950

- National Security Council
  - Alger Hiss; "Pumpkin Papers"  
↳ document found in  
a pumpkin which show  
Hiss is guilty
  - THAC
  - Alger Hiss sues Chambers for libel  
(ruining his reputation)

- Wipe out all prior history and culture.

## Arms Race

- Soviets try their own bomb

- now there are two nuclear weapons!

- 1952: US develops the H-Bomb

- ICBM's: Intercontinental  
Ballistic Missiles

## North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) [1949]

- Designed for defense

- If there is an attack on any one of the nations, it is an attack on all.

1953: Stalin dies; Kruschev takes power

## Warsaw Pact (1955)

- Response to NATO

- Communist European nations

Premier Nikita Khrushchev ascending power

## The Korean War: A "Police Action" 1950-1953

- N. Korea Communist backed by Soviets

- S. Korea Anti-communist dictator

## Eisenhower (1953-1961)

- WWII General

- Domino theory for communist spread
